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





Responding to Student Feedback on Scheduling

New course scheduling system designed to:

- Reduce curricular bottlenecks
 + student course conflicts
- Decrease time to degree
- Decrease unnecessary course-related student
 travel
- Facilitate course "right-sizing" to reduce the number of closed sections
- Manage school and university enrollments
- Enable improved classroom planning and renovation
