Communication and Strategic Planning Satisfaction

Areas of Satisfaction:



63% of faculty are satisfied with the level of faculty input within their department and more than **60%** are satisfied with the communication of priorities from their chairperson.

42% of faculty are satisfied with the level of faculty input at the faculty leadership level and **43%** are satisfied with the communication of priorities.



More than **31%** of faculty are satisfied with the level of faculty input at the school level. More than **34%** are satisfied with the communication of priorities from their Dean.



25% of faculty believe faculty and administrators have a shared sense of responsibility.



29% of faculty find shared governance at Rutgers to be effective.

Areas for Improvement:

1 in 4 faculty members believe faculty governance structures offer opportunities for input.



54% of faculty are not satisfied with the communication of priorities from presidential or chancellor level leadership.

37% of faculty believe faculty and administration "seldom" or "never" have an open system of communication.
